

Keyworkers are your own trusted adult who will make sure you have everything you need, set your reward targets and they will also help you to keep in touch with your family.

We will **introduce** you to the other boys who stay here. You may have already met some of them when you come to visit!


We will have asked someone to "buddy" you, so that you are shown where everything is and have a friend to help you.

The residential boys say the staff are cool and always have fun and make the evenings enjoyable. Always getting involved in football, swimming, clip and climb, roller skating and gaming. . There not the only activities ... we do loads! TELL US WHAT YOU WOULD LIKE TO DO!!!

Chalk Hill is quite big, we have a large kitchen with two ovens and dining room, two lounge with Tv, Xbox and fuss ball. A computer room, medical room, 12 bedrooms and a large garden. With a nature trail and football pitch with goals.

We really want you to be happy while you're staying with us and feel at home here so you will be able to have posters, pictures and decorations on the walls.

It is your own personal space and we will knock on the door before we come in. You will be given a save place to put your phones and valuables. Don't worry you will still get to call your family and have your phone returned when you go back home. **Boarding**

Time to rest

Under 12's Bedtime Routines

From 6:30 p.m (18:30 hours) you will have your shower or bath, decide what film you want and make any phone calls you need to make.

From 8:00 p.m. (20:00 hours). We will start supper when you are finished in the bathroom.

You need to be in your own room, on your own. Staff will start to "settle you" – read a story, have a chat, play cards – for 10 minutes IF they can. There will be no phone calls after this time. TV's will come out of your room. Settling has finished. Lights out. Stay in rooms and try and go to sleep.

Over 12's Bedtime Routines

From 7:30 p.m. (19:30 hours) you should be thinking about your shower, thinking about what film you want and any phone calls you need to make.

From 8:00 p.m. (20:00 hours) you should be having your bath or shower. We will start supper when you are finished in the bathroom.

You need to be in your own room, on your own by 9:00 p.m. (21:00 hours). Staff will start to "settle you" – read a story, have a chat, play cards – for 10 minutes IF they can. There will be no phone calls after this time. Tv's out of your rooms at 9:15 p.m. (21:15 hours). Settling time also finishes. 9:30 p.m. (21:30 hours) -Lights out, stay in rooms and try and go to sleep. Bedtinge

Your wellbeing

Be Safe

We have regular fire drills at Chalk Hill to make sure that you know what to do if you hear the alarm. This will be explained to you and everyone goes to the front of the School when it happens.

Other children are not allowed in each other's bedrooms after settling time at night and if you are in someone else's room in the day or have children in your room then please keep the door open so that the staff can check you're all ok.

Sometimes children might be upset or angry. Staff will always help you if this happens and make sure that no one is hurt. Sometimes if a child is very upset or angry staff may have to hold them and while this can be upsetting the staff are taught how to do this in a safe way.

You'll always be able to talk to someone if you're upset and after you've calmed down.

Healthy approach

We want you to be fit and healthy whilst you living here and will arrange for you to take part in different activities and sports which you like to help you with this.

The School is non-smoking and we can help anyone who smokes to try and give up. Also NO drugs or alcohol are allowed in the School and will be taken from anyone who has them.

Information about giving up smoking or the risks associated with drug and alcohol abuse is in the home for everyone to read.





What do I do if I'm worried, upset or not happy about something?

It's really important that you talk to us if you're not happy or upset or worried about anything at all, we understand that this may be difficult when you don't know us very well but we only want to help!

There are also people from outside the home that you can talk to, such as the Independent Visitor and you can leave a note for them if you like in the post box in the computer room.

What happens if I do something wrong?

Listen & Learn

We will **always** work with you to try and put things right if something goes wrong! If you do something illegal or harmful to other children or carers then you may be excluded.

We are always here to talk , you can trust us

We will always help you to stay in touch with the people important to you.

We have a phone you can use to call family when you want to (but not after 9.00pm (21:00 hours).

Your family are welcome to come and visit you here if they arrange it in advance.

Other People who make sure we are looking after you!

OFSTED is a government organisation that inspects all children's homes to make sure they are run well and that we follow your placement plan and look after you properly and safely.



An Inspector visits us once a year. Sometimes before they come, they will send you a questionnaire to fill in and during the visits the Inspector will want to speak to you and may ask questions about how you find at staying at Chalk Hill.

Standard 3 Visitor or Independent Visitor - They visit the School every half term and produces an independent report, which goes into great detail about your care, and the way the school operates.

The independent Visitor is interested in hearing what you think about the home, and is always willing to chat with you. You can see her when she visits or leave a note for her in the post box in the computer room if you would like her to know something.
